



HLF 'SPECIAL EVENT' SATURDAY OCTOBER 19TH Last year – as most of you are well aware! – the Group received a Heritage Lottery Fund grant for an 'All Our Stories' project centred on the Second World War. As part of this project, a 'Special Event' was held on October 19th at The Barn Theatre, Little Easton. There was an exhibition featuring artefacts, documents, photographs and stories, representing some of the experiences of ordinary people in Tilty and the surrounding villages during the war. There was also a staged re-enactment of a BBC radio programme from Christmas Day 1940 (abridged for performance), part of which was originally broadcast from Tilty Village Hall.



the exhibition, participated in the re-enactment (both on and off stage), provided and served up the refreshments, played a ukulele or a hand-bell, joined in the sing-song, or just came along to join us!

This has been an interesting year for our Group, and the HLF project has helped to involve people in exploring and sharing their local heritage in a variety of ways. Live music followed, provided by a woodwind quartet, and then by The Phoenix Ukulele Band, who played songs from the forties for a sing-along. Excellent 'vintage teas' were served to all at no charge, but voluntary contributions raised £178 for the Royal British Legion.
