across two workshops last July. Part 1 was a presentation about archaeological processes and techniques, with advice and guidance about the practicalities involved in investigations. Part 2 provided us with the opportunity to put some of the



theory into practice with testpit digging in the garden at Clerk's Cottage, Tilty. Although we



didn't discover any buried treasure, we did come across many interesting items of various kinds, and thoroughly enjoyed the process of digging them out. The day's events were well attended, and people participated in a variety of tasks, including digging, clearing and sieving the earth from the pits, and washing, sorting and recording the finds. It was a useful learning

experience, and we are planning another dig this autumn – over two days in September.

We had a good turnout for the Pillbox Walk on **SUNDAY 26TH OCTOBER** – 25 people, and one dog! Alf Wright lead us on an interesting tour around the numerous pillboxes in the vicinity – most of which can be viewed from public footpaths. However, we were also very grateful to several people who allowed us to take a look inside pillboxes located in their gardens.
