Saffron Walden

THE ORIGIN of any town is often wrapped up in its name. The meaning of the word "Walden" has given those, who are expert in such matters, much cause of argument, and they are undecided whether it should be translated as the "Forest Valley"—which it certainly was,—or the "Britons" Valley"—which again fits the marshy forest hollow to which the Britons retired from their exposed position on Ring Hill, when the Romans established themselves further down the valley of the Cam, at Chesterford.

After the Saxons had replaced the Romans as the predominant power in the land, Walden was under Ansgar, Edward the Confessor's Master of the Horse, who was in command of the Cavalry at the time of the Battle of Hastings.

From that time onwards strands of royalty can be found interwoven in the pattern of Walden's history,—especially connected with some of England's Queens.

Is it not to Queen Matilda that Walden owes its Market, through a licence granted to Geoffrey de Mandeville, the builder of Walden Abbey? The act of a later Queen, Margaret of Anjou (Henry VI's Queen), was less complimentary to the town, for, taking umbrage at the town's neglect to ring a peal on the occasion of her visit to the Abbey in 1452, she fined the bell-ringers. (Perhaps this was less an instance of offended royalty than an excuse for a small addition to the Queen's coffers in aid of the struggle against her Yorkist opponents).

It may not be generally realised that a Walden Guild (of the Holy Trinity) numbered among its members a King and his Queen,—Henry VIII and Katherine,—enrolled on the occasion of the Guild's foundation in 1513, when it was entrusted with the local government of the town.

When Henry's daughter, Queen Elizabeth I, visited Audley End,—which was no longer an Abbey,—the town naturally received her with honour, though possibly with mixed feelings; for was not the fact, that her father at the end of his reign had abolished the Guild, balanced by the fact that through the instrumentality of her Secretary of State, Sir Thomas Smith (himself a Walden man), the right of self-government had been restored to the town, when her brother, Edward VI, was King.

Thereafter it became customary for the Burgesses of Saffron Walden to present a loyal address and a gift of saffron to royal visitors at Audley End, and for a time the Mansion became a royal Palace, under Charles II.

Finally, in the year 1953, when we mourn the passing of one Queen and celebrate the Coronation of her granddaughter, it is fitting to recall that on the one hand Queen Mary was the last royal visitor to Audley End before it ceased to be a private residence, and on the other hand that the Saffron Walden constituency has had the honour of finding a Chancellor of the Exchequer for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Children attending Primary and Secondary Schools maintained by the Local Education Authority are to receive a gift of an illustrated Commemorative Book. (Distribution will be made through the Schools).

BOROUGH GIFT

Over 600 applications for the Borough Souvenir gift were received from old-age pensioners and persons eligible for this pension. The gift, which is a souvenir caddy containing half-pound of tea, will be distributed to the applicants at the Town Hall on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday (26th—28th May) between the hours of 10—12 a.m. and 2—4 p.m. daily.

Special arrangements will be announced in the Local Press for the distribution to applicants, who, through age or infirmity, are unable to attend.
