The weather was glorious again – and the Soapbox Day was a great success, raising funds for the Great Easton Community Association, and for Centre Algarve.

GENERAL MEETINGS

There was an external speaker for our **MAY MEETING**: Gary Matthews, from the Gardens of Easton Lodge, with a presentation about the Countess of Warwick and the Gardens. Gary provided us with an entertaining and informative evening, and shared some great photographs and stories with us. Committee Members Darren and Maggie gave presentations for the **JULY MEETING**. Darren talked about the Maternity Home at Great Easton; he has carried out a great deal of research into its history, and some of his findings can be found on the Group website [http://www.tiltyhistoryprojects.co.uk/people-places/great-easton-maternity-home-1896-1924]. Maggie gave a short talk about Stone Hall and its history, and finished the evening with a presentation about some 19th century 'rappers' – people paid by the church to prod awake those who fell asleep during services. A newspaper report in 1891 mentioned most of our local churches, including Tilty where a 5 ft. long staff was used for this purpose!
